## **VISION**

NVCEO is recognized by the equestrian community, the media, and elected officials as an active coalition of regional equestrian organizations and a leader in the development of strategies for the education of the general public in equestrian issues.

# MISSION STATEMENT

The Northern Virginia Coalition of Equestrian Organizations (NVCEO) stimulates and encourages collaborative action and efficient use of resources by the Northern Virginia equestrian community in the education and influence of local and regional decision makers by:

- 1. Maintaining a representative organization of Northern Virginia equestrian organizations whose purpose is to advance equestrian interests in the region.
- 2. Coordinating resources to provide a unified voice in issues affecting the equestrian community.
- 3. Providing the general public with positive education regarding the benefits provided by the equestrian community.
- 4. Acting as an information resource for Northern Virginia equestrian organizations in issues affecting the equestrian community.
- 5. Establishing positive, partner-based relationships with local and regional public use facilities on behalf of the region's equestrian community.
- 6. Multiplying the effectiveness of the equestrian community by sharing resources and coordinating efforts.
- 7. NVCEO representation includes the Cities of Alexandria and Arlington, and Counties of Fairfax, Loudoun, Prince William, and Fauquier.

### Requirements of an Organization's Delegates to the NVCEO

- 1. Agreement with the vision and mission of the NVCEO.
- 2. Ability to serve to help achieve the vision of the NVCEO.
- 3. The NVCEO holds an annual "Presidents & Leaders" meeting in January each year. The Board of Directors, made up of the Delegates from the Member Organizations, will meet in March, June, September and December. There may be a maximum of three delegates per organization, two of which are voting delegates. Delegates can change at any time with notification to the NVCEO. Delegate are also welcome to join Executive Committee conference calls/meetings during off months of February, April, May, July, August, October and November.
